## **NBC 6 FLORIDA POLL**

### HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED

**This poll was conducted by Mason-Dixon Polling & Strategy, Inc. of Jacksonville, Florida from October 1 through October 4, 2024.**

**A total of 625 registered voters statewide were interviewed live by telephone in Florida. All indicated they were likely to vote in the November general election.**

**Those interviewed were randomly selected from a phone-matched Florida voter registration list that included both land-line and cell phone numbers. Quotas were assigned to voter turnout by county.**

**The margin for error, according to standards customarily used by statisticians, is no more than  $\pm 4$  percentage points. This means that there is a 95 percent probability that the "true" figure would fall within that range if all voters in Florida were surveyed. The margin for error is higher for any subgroup, such as a gender or age grouping.**
